Workshop II: Rare Disease & Newborn Screening

This session will look at the impact state newborn screening programs have in changing the outcomes of rare diseases in our children. The panel will discuss Spinal Muscular Atrophy (SMA) in particular and how newborn screening is changing the lives and outcomes for children in the US. SMA is a devastating rare disease that robs people, mostly children, of physical strength by affecting the motor nerve cells in the spinal cord, taking away the ability to walk, eat, or breathe. It is the number one genetic cause of death for infants. SMA affects approximately 1 in 11,000 babies, about 1 in every 50 Americans is a genetic carrier and can affect any race or gender.

In 2018, Ohio passed breakthrough bipartisan payday loan reform to protect the budgets of hardworking consumers while maintaining widespread access to credit. The new law promises to save borrowers, who are typically women, \$75 million each year.
